and the other side of the paper
is covered with a large number of
smaller circles, which are all
of different sizes and shapes.
The paper is very thin and
fragile, and it is difficult to
handle it without breaking it.
There are some small holes in
the paper, particularly near the
edges, which appear to be
caused by insects or by
the action of water on the
paper itself. There are also
some very small spots of
dust or debris scattered
over the surface of the paper,
but they do not appear to
be any particular kind of
debris.

It is a very interesting
specimen, and it is
certainly a valuable addition
to any collection of
old documents or historical
objects.
