

These three sections of extempore writing
 were written from memory and
 contain a history of mental and spiritual growth
 from youth in one's native land to
 manhood in a foreign country.
 The first section is a brief summary
 of the author's life up to the age of 20.
 It describes his early education at home
 and abroad, his studies at the University of
 Cambridge, and his subsequent travels
 through Europe and America.
 The second section is a detailed account
 of his conversion to Christianity and his
 subsequent religious experiences.
 The third section is a summary of his
 life since his conversion, including his
 work as a teacher and his travels
 throughout the world.
 The author has written this history
 in a simple, direct style, without
 any attempt at literary ornamentation.
 He has tried to convey the truth
 of his experience in a clear and
 concise manner, without any
 unnecessary detail or embellishment.
 He has also tried to keep the focus
 on the spiritual aspects of his life,
 rather than on the material or
 worldly aspects.
