the cause of embankments, of abounding in timber and
very fine wheat, and cattle, which, however, have not
been equalled by any part of the continent up
to it. The marshes were formerly very densely thick with
cypress and juniper trees, which the Indians
cut down and converted into a large number of small canoes, now
in various parts of the country. They were
also enlarged and made ready for use. In addition, they
had many small boats, which they used for fishing.
The Indians at this time had no houses, living in
the open air, and in the winter time, sleeping in houses
which they had made of brushwood, and branches,
and a covering of dried reeds, which they had gathered
near their houses, which were built in the same
manner as those of the Indians.
